While reading a research article consider these questions ...

- 1. What is the problem that the authors are trying to address?
- 2. Why is it important or relevant to libraries/NZ libraries/your library?
- 3. What are the authors trying to achieve with their study? What question are they asking?
- 4. How will this address the problem in 1?
- 5. What research strategy did the authors use?
- 6. What methods did they use to carry out this strategy?
- 7. Were these methods the most appropriate for what they were trying to achieve?
- 8. What other methods could have been used and how would they answer the question differently?
- 9. What ethical considerations were needed to carry out this study?
- 10. Was the data/information collected of sufficient quality to draw reliable and valid conclusions?
- 11. How was the data/information analysed? Was this appropriate for the data/information collected?
- 12. Did the data/information collected allow the authors to answer the question in 3? How?
- 13. Did this contribute to addressing the problem in 1? How?
- 14. What future work did the authors identify as arising from their study? Can you think of other research that could be done to contribute to addressing the problem in 1?
- 15. Would you be interested in doing such a study?
